#### RESPONSE 1

Thanks for the info. I would like to ask a question regarding the "formula":

According to [Ohio Higher Ed's CCP resources](#) (click on Funding Information under Guidance on Rules & Regulations - I've also pasted the relevant chart below), **the ceiling rate per credit hour for a CCP student taught "on the college campus" is \$166.55** (is it less if the course is DL? Not clear). That's less than half the rate of the full-pay in-state student. This clearly would affect the net profit, and this is of serious concern in the my Program, since it is no secret that we end up with significant numbers of CCP students in many, if not most, of our summer courses (and of course, many of our fall and spring semester courses, too).

This is a fact that cannot be dismissed.

We had some Summer I courses canceled, even though the courses were full and had several students on the Wait Lists. We are hoping the same does not happen to Summer II.

On one hand, I know that the University's hands are tied, so to speak, because we must accept CCP students. However, one of those challenges is that the number of CCP students per course is not capped nor supervised by the University.

Thanks for keeping us as informed as possible.

#### RESPONSE 2

The summer class I lost had an enrollment of 19 and my salary would have been only \$6500. That would mean of the 19 students enrolled, at least 11 would have to have been scholarships for the course to not be profitable. Do CCPs count as scholarship? (Even so, there were not 11 CCPs.)
